**BAPTISM:** The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated monthly on the last Saturday of the month at 2 p.m. To prepare for the Sacrament, parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism catechesis that is scheduled every second Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m.. All Godparents have to have attained the age of 16; not be the child's parent; be a practicing Catholic and also need to have received the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. Each Godparent needs to provide a Letter/Certificate signed and sealed from their own Parish stating that they are a member in good standing and have completed the baptism class. For more information and registration forms, please contact the office.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Couples planning to marry in the Church must meet with a priest for several preparation meetings and attend an Engaged Encounter weekend. A minimum of 6 months is required.

**SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Please notify the office or rectory when a family member is about to be hospitalized, is hospitalized, or is confined at home due to sickness, or aging. In the hospital, ask your nurse to page the on-call Hospital Chaplain. The Chaplain will call the priest assigned for the day to the hospital to provide spiritual care and meet the sacramental needs of the patient.

**FUNERALS:** We ask families to call the Parish Office **PRIOR** to any arrangements with the Mortuary to avoid conflicts.

**HOUSE BLESSINGS:** If possible, we ask parishioners to schedule house blessings at least one week in advance.

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** Are invited to join our parish family. Please register at the Parish Office.

(Reflection on Sunday Gospel)

**"The baptism of repentance and purification in the Holy Spirit"**

John the Baptist's life was fueled by one burning passion - to point others to Jesus Christ and to the coming of his kingdom. Who is John the Baptist and what is the significance of his message for our lives? Scripture tells us that John was *filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb* (Luke 1:15, 41) by Christ himself, whom Mary had just conceived by the Holy Spirit. When Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth John leaped in her womb as they were filled with the Holy Spirit (Luke 1:41). The fire of the Spirit dwelt in John and made him the forerunner of the coming Messiah. John was led by the Spirit into the wilderness prior to his ministry where he grew in the word of God and was tested in preparation for his prophetic mission. John's clothing was reminiscent of the prophet Elijah (see Kings 1:8).

**A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT**

Today's second reading is about Christ's coming again, "The day of the Lord," Peter calls it, but that day isn't December 25th. It's that other day, that second-coming- day about which Peter is concerned. He waits with great hope and anticipation for God to remake the earth into a place of perfect justice and peace. And he sets some demanding goals for the Christian community as it awaits that final day of accounting and reconciliation: strive to be at peace, without spot or blemish. Christian stewards work for peace. As we await the coming of Christmas, what can we do to promote peace in our homes, workplaces, community and world?

**1st Joyful Mystery: The Annunciation**

Luke 1:35 (NAB): "The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you" How do we evangelize? First and foremost, "BE A PERSON OF PRAYER".

Perhaps, some are afraid to share the Good News because we do not know what to say or we feel unworthy. Or the opposite can happen – we are so fired up to share the Good News because of our own eloquence or competence.

The 1st joyful mystery teaches us that we evangelize only by cooperating with God. Mary was with the Holy Spirit from the Incarnation of Jesus up to Pentecost with the Apostles. We are able to evangelize with the power of the Holy Spirit, not with our own power. Immersed in God through prayer and the Eucharist, we are overshadowed by the Holy Spirit. Thus, we can evangelize.

"Do not worry about how you are to speak. You will be given at that moment what you are to say. For it will not be you who speak but the Holy Spirit of your Father speaking through you." (Mt 10:19-20)

**Let us be open to be used by God. Pray daily and reverently.**
