BAPTISM: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated monthly on the last Saturday of the month at 2 p.m. To prepare for the Sacrament, parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism catechesis that is scheduled every second Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m.. All Godparents have to have attained the age of 16; not be the child's parent; be a practicing Catholic and also need to have received the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. Each Godparent needs to provide a Letter/Certificate signed and sealed from their own Parish stating that they are a member in good standing and have completed the baptism class. For more information and registration forms, please contact the office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Couples planning to marry in the Church must meet with a priest for several preparation meetings and attend an Engaged Encounter weekend. A minimum of 6 months is required.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please notify the office or rectory when a family member is about to be hospitalized, is hospitalized, or is confined at home due to sickness, or aging. In the hospital, ask your nurse to page the on-call Hospital Chaplain. The Chaplain will call the priest assigned for the day to the hospital to provide spiritual care and meet the sacramental needs of the patient.

FUNERALS: We ask families to call the Parish Office **PRIOR** to any arrangements with the Mortuary to avoid conflicts.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: If possible, we ask parishioners to schedule house blessings at least one week in advance.

NEW PARISIONERS: Are invited to join our parish family. Please register at the Parish Office.

(Reflection on Sunday Gospel)

Repent and believe in the Gospel

What is the significance of Jesus spending 40 days and nights of solitude, prayer and fasting in the Judean wilderness? In the Old Testament 40 days was often seen as a significant period of testing and preparation for entering into a covenant relationship with God. In the days of Noah, God judged the earth and destroyed its inhabitants in a great flood because of their idolatry and total rejection of God. Noah and his family were spared because they obeyed God and took refuge in the ark for 40 days. When the flood subsided God made a covenant with Noah and promised that he would not destroy the human race again. Jesus came to fulfill that promise.

REST IN PEACE

Sr. Dorothy Santos, SS.CC. age 96, went home to God on Thursday night, February 1, 2018 at about 9:45 p.m. Born in Makawao Maui, Sister entered the Congregation of the Sisters of the Sacred Hearts in August in 1945. She taught at Sacred Hearts convent, Marie Regina School in Gardena, California, and St. Patrick School here on Oahu. In 1982-1988 she assisted in the infirmary in Nuuanu and then in 1988-2009 at Malia O Ka Malu. She was well known for creating beautiful life size mosaics which were prominently displayed in Hawaii on Oahu, Kauai, Molokai, various places in the U.S. Rome, Japan, Indonesia, Tonga, Fiji, India and Bangalore. Sr. Dorothy is survived by a brother Lionel Santos and Maryknoll Sister Cecelia Santos. Services were held on Monday, Feb 12 at St. Patrick Church.

Suicides have become a serious public health crisis in Hawaii, with one person dying from suicide in our islands every other day. We believe every life is precious and that preventing suicides is everyone’s kuleana. We, the undersigned, believe every person is entitled to be safe at every stage in life, including those who may be marginalized such as the elderly, those who are disabled or have mental health challenges, and others. We believe awareness and suicide prevention programs are key to supporting the most vulnerable, consistent with our island values of caring for others like family. We believe physician-assisted suicide is not consistent with these values and sends conflicting messages to Hawaii’s youth about suicide. *Therefore, as a way to further reduce the prevalence of suicide in our state by 25% by 2025, we believe it is critical to concurrently prevent the legalization of assisted-suicide in our state.*

In the same way, you should refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace. A smile and a heartfelt "Peace be with you" should suffice. Likewise if you are not comfortable sharing the sign of peace or receiving Holy Communion from the communal chalice for fear of infection, you should feel no pressure to do so. All of us must be aware of such sensitive matters in the intimate life of the Christian community and we should expect that some will refrain from the sign of peace and the communal chalice out of care for our well being and not out of unkindness or a lack of piety.
