BAPTISM: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated monthly on the last Saturday of the month at 2 p.m. To prepare for the Sacrament, parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism catechesis that is scheduled every second Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m.. All Godparents have to have attained the age of 16; not be the child's parent; be a practicing Catholic and also need to have received the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. Each Godparent needs to provide a Letter/Certificate signed and sealed from their own Parish stating that they are a member in good standing and have completed the baptism class. For more information and registration forms, please contact the office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Couples planning to marry in the Church must meet with a priest for several preparation meetings and attend an Engaged Encounter weekend. A minimum of 6 months is required.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please notify the office or rectory when a family member is about to be hospitalized, is hospitalized, or is confined at home due to sickness, or aging. In the hospital, ask your nurse to page the on-call Hospital Chaplain. The Chaplain will call the priest assigned for the day to the hospital to provide spiritual care and meet the sacramental needs of the patient.

FUNERALS: We ask families to call the Parish Office **PRIOR** to any arrangements with the Mortuary to avoid conflicts.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: If possible, we ask parishioners to schedule house blessings at least one week in advance.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Are invited to join our parish family. Please register at the Parish Office.

God Condemns Domestic Violence

Leaving Akamu with his aunt, Evangeline made her way to the hospital to have her jaw wired shut and her face stitched at the emergency room. By the time she got home almost a day later, her weariness was overwhelming; all she wanted to do was to lie next to her baby. Two-year old Akamu, still sucking a pacifier, kept touching and softly stroking her severe "ow-wees." Even he knew something was wrong.

Absolutely, our faith recognizes that marriage is indissoluble, that "what God has joined together, no human being must separate" Matthew 19:6. We are called, esp. in today's throwaway society, to live out the marriage sacrament for our entire lives. The human communion of a husband and wife in the sacrament of Matrimony "is confirmed, purified and completed by communion in Jesus Christ" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC 1644). But, God did not intend for us to be abused! Not sexually, physically, emotionally or spiritually. The commandments forbid killing and Jesus denounced even having enough anger to want to harm another (Mt. 5: 21-22).

And if someone wants to harm us? "Love toward oneself remains a fundamental principle of morality. Therefore it is legitimate to insist on respect for one's own right to life" (CCC 2264).

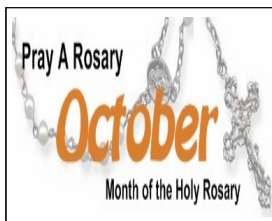

(Reflection on Sunday Gospel)

They would not come to the feast!

What can a royal wedding party tell us about God's kingdom? One of the most beautiful images used in the Scriptures to depict what heaven is like is the wedding celebration and royal feast given by the King for his newly-wed son and bride. Whatever grand feast we can imagine on earth, heaven is the feast of all feasts because the Lord of heaven and earth invites us to the most important banquet of all - not simply as bystanders or guests - but as members of Christ's own body, his bride the church! The last book in the Bible ends with an invitation to the wedding feast of the Lamb - the Lord Jesus who offered his life as an atoning sacrifice for our sins and who now reigns as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. *The Spirit and the Bride say, Come!* (Revelations 22:17). The Lord Jesus invites us to be united with himself in his heavenly kingdom of peace and righteousness.
