BAPTISM: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated monthly on the last Saturday of the month at 2 p.m. To prepare for the Sacrament, parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism catechesis that is scheduled every second Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m.. All Godparents have to have attained the age of 16; not be the child's parent; be a practicing Catholic and also need to have received the sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, First Eucharist, and Confirmation. Each Godparent needs to provide a Letter/Certificate signed and sealed from their own Parish stating that they are a member in good standing and have completed the baptism class. For more information and registration forms, please contact the office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Couples planning to marry in the Church must meet with a priest for several preparation meetings and attend an Engaged Encounter weekend. A minimum of 6 months is required.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please notify the office or rectory when a family member is about to be hospitalized, is hospitalized, or is confined at home due to sickness, or aging. In the hospital, ask your nurse to page the on-call Hospital Chaplain. The Chaplain will call the priest assigned for the day to the hospital to provide spiritual care and meet the sacramental needs of the patient.

FUNERALS: We ask families to call the Parish Office **PRIOR** to any arrangements with the Mortuary to avoid conflicts.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: If possible, we ask parishioners to schedule house blessings at least one week in advance.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Are invited to join our parish family. Please register at the Parish Office.

What can mustard seeds teach us about the kingdom of God? The tiny mustard seed literally grew to be a tree which attracted numerous birds because they loved the little black mustard seed it produced. God's kingdom works in a similar fashion. It starts from the smallest beginnings in the hearts of men and women who are receptive to God's word. And it works unseen and causes a transformation from within. Just as a seed has no power to change itself until it is planted in the ground, so we cannot change our lives to be like God until God gives us the power of his Holy Spirit.

One famous saying is that no good deed goes unpunished. We call it Murphy's Law. After we choose good, when we make a decision for the good of ourselves or others, THEN "life" happens.

The spiritual truth of this is critical for those of us who want to follow Jesus, who want to share God with others, who want to grow in holiness. The truth is that after we decide to take another step towards God, towards others and towards the best version of ourselves, well, the Enemy of Our Human Nature will work overtime to make sure we don't actually succeed. (Example, just deciding to pray more is not actually doing it.)

How helpful it is to remember this! If we decide to be more loving, to drink less, to spend more time with our keiki...if we decide to move closer to Jesus....we need not be surprised by all the bad that life begins to throw at us. And we definitely cannot let ourselves be derailed by any bad that befalls us after choosing good!

This is not a sign you are doing something wrong. It is a sign you are choosing God, the author of all that is good. (And a sign that the Evil One and our sinful selves is not happy about it.)

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus compares the beginning of God's kingdom to a mustard seed. This tiny seed, which fits in the palm of a hand, can grow to fifteen feet with sprawling branches! Like the mustard seed, the Christian community had a tiny, seemingly insignificant beginning. The church, which began with about 120 followers, added three thousand people on Pentecost Day following the descent of the Holy Spirit. Since then, the number of Christ's disciples has grown incalculably and continues to grow throughout the world. Good stewards go about God's business of "planting seeds" among all those whom they encounter. What will we do this week to add to God's kingdom?
