Words from the Pastor

The word "Christmas" comes from the words Cristes maesse or "Christ's Mass" Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus, the Savior of all humankind.

Christmas is an occasion of joy. We come to an even greater appreciation of what Christ has done for us. We rejoice in the fact that his birth in that simple manger in Bethlehem opened for us the way to salvation.

On this Year of Eucharistic Revival, let us reenergize, refocus, and renew our belief of the real presence of Christ. He is *Emmanuel* meaning "God is with us." The presence of God is everywhere, and it comes in many ways. However, there is a very special and unique way that Jesus comes into us and remain with us, it is through the Eucharist. BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATES

December 06, 2022



Our Future: The St. Joseph's Church Master Plan created by Chris Hart & Partners, Inc. in 2004 concluded, "the existing gym was of "questionable serviceability." Problems include dry rot and termite damage and deficiencies in the electrical system. Replacement of this building with a new multi-purpose parish center building would better serve the St, Joseph's Parish and school communities over the long-term future." There are two permits that are still pending with Maui County:

• State Historic Preservation Department (SHPD) –Mason Architects on Oahu has completed all documents required and submitted these documents to the State Historic Preservation Department. The Maui County Engineering Department will review these documents and issue permits after the review is complete.

 Maui County Water Department has asked for more information regarding installing a backflow and fire prevention sprinkler system. That permit is still pending

Our Legacy: Restoring the Church: Work has begun with the cleaning and water sealing of the statue of Jesus facing Makawao Avenue. Arrangements are being made with Tri-Isle Transportation to move five religious statues from the church to artist Kim Mosley's studio in Kihei. The artists are also in the process of replicating the spires on the Stations of the Cross. After they are replicated, they will be installed. When restoration of the


stained-glass windows begins, a work day will be scheduled to have parishioners participate in the cleaning of the windows before restoration begins.

Another major project that the committee is currently working on is repair of the steeple. During high winds and rain, the steeple rocks and water leaks in through the bell tower. A request has been submitted to the finance committee to provide funding needed to begin the planning process.

Our Present: The committee is also seeking an assessment from No Presha Plumbing to repair the plumbing in the convent.

The committee is assessing the lighting at the school building to upgrade to modern LED lights.

The committee is assessing the need for a security system with updated locks and cameras to protect parish members and church treasures.

WHAT IS RCIA.... RCIA which stands for

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a process through which non-baptized men and women enter the Catholic Church. (It is also for those baptized in a different faith tradition who wish to become Catholic, or baptized Catholic and

would like a refresher course, or baptized Catholic but never confirmed) It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass. Participants in the RCIA are known as catechumens. They undergo a process of conversion as they study N the Gospel, profess faith in Jesus and the Catholic Church, and receive the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

Classes will be held every Thursday at 7 p.m. and will began on August 25, 2022.
